SPECIAL RULES

This show is subject to the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo General Rules, the Junior Livestock Show Special Rules, and Special Rules listed in this section.

1. Entry: Each owner is limited to one (1) barrow. Only barrows may be entered.

2. Validation: To be eligible to exhibit in the Junior Market Barrow Show, all barrows must be validated in the Texas 4-H and FFA Swine Validation Program. Each entry must have been recorded on a 4-H or FFA Swine Validation Form Master List completed by the County Swine Validation Committee. Failure to comply with the rules and regulations of the Texas Swine Validation Program in any manner will result in immediate disqualification.

3. Stalling: Stalling will occur on a first-come, first-serve basis; animals must arrive together to be stalled together.

4. Classification: Breed must be declared upon arrival. Breed changes following initial breed declaration must take place at the Main Livestock Office and will be accessed a \$25 fee. All breed changes must be recorded before 2 pm the day of check-in. Barrows will be subject to reclassification by three-member committee. Any barrows reclassified in wave 1 will be placed in the Dark Crossbred breed. Any barrows reclassified in wave 2 will be placed in the Crossbred breed. Crossbred and Dark Crossbred class options may be entered at the time weight cards are turned in. Any barrows in Group #1 not meeting at least the classification standards for the Dark Crossbred breed will be sifted. The decision of the three-member classifying committee will be final. See Barrow Classification Standards.

5. Ear Tags & Show Weights: Only TX Validation tags are allowed in barrows, all other tags must be removed before showing. The TX Validation Tag number will be used for animal identification. Exhibitors will turn in the official show weight for their barrow. Show Weight will range from 230 to 270 lbs. All barrows with weights turned in outside of this range, will be sifted. Weight changes will not be allowed at any time.

6. Show Check-in Procedures: Exhibitors must check-in and complete the State Validation Tag Number, Weight, and Breed Designation of the of the Barrow Disposition Form. Upon completion, the exhibitor will be given the remaining sections of the Barrow Disposition Form, consisting of the Livestock Office Copy, Market Copy, and Exhibitor Copy. Exhibitors will not be allowed to show without the Barrow Disposition Form in hand. Check-in must be completed by 2:00 pm the day of check-in, or be disqualified.

7. Fitting: The use of talc, oils, or any foreign material is prohibited. No clipping of swine will be permitted on grounds. No electric clippers will be allowed on grounds. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification.

8. Feeding: Feed/water troughs will NOT be furnished.

9. Class Re-weigh: All barrows penned for placing consideration will be re-weighed. Barrows with weights more than 10 lbs above or below the weight turned in will be disqualified. Barrows with weights more than 10 lbs below the turned in weight will be disqualified, sold on the re-weigh weight, and a \$20 office handling fee will be deducted from their floor check.

10. Grand Champion Re-weigh: Prior to selection of the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion, all Breed Champions and Reserve Breed Champions will be re-weighed:

Group #1 Barrows (Berkshire, Hampshire, Spot, Duroc, Poland, Dark Crossbred) weighing 15 lbs. less than the minimum or more than 15 lbs. above the weigh-in weight will be disqualified.

Group #2 Barrows (Chester White, Landrace, York, Crossbred) weighing 10 lbs. less than the minimum or more than 10 lbs. above the weigh-in weight will be disqualified.

Should a Champion or Reserve weigh-out, he would retain his status as Breed Champion or Reserve Breed Champion but be ineligible to compete for Grand or Reserve Grand Champion.

11. Scales: Scales will be provided in areas throughout the barn. No other scales will be allowed.

12. Medication: Administration of any medication to market animals that is not approved by the FDA is a violation of Federal law. Read all label directions and observe all required withdrawal periods. Please refer to rule #30 of the General Rules.

13. Junior Auction: Decoration of market animals for the Junior Auction is prohibited; animals must be presented for Auction in their natural show state (i.e. no glitter, paint, balloons, etc. allowed).

14. Certified Texas Bred Class Champions: The Texas Pork Producers Association, Inc. (P.O. Box 10168 - Austin, TX 78766) may award premium money to top placing Certified Texas Bred barrows. A Certified Texas Bred Registry certificate from the breeder must be presented at the show to qualify.

15. Classes: Superintendents will break classes after all weights have been turned in. Classes within a breed, will be broken as evenly as possible. Classes will be broken by weight. In the event of a large number of barrows with the same weight and the same breed, the show may break them into multiple classes using another method other than weight. To more effectively break classes, weights may be grouped by a maximum of 3 lb. increments and classes then broke using another method other than weight.

2009 SAN ANTONIO STOCK SHOW & RODEO
BARROW CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS FOR GROUP #1

All animals must be properly ear notched within seven (7) days of birth with a litter notch in the right ear and individual notch in the left ear to be eligible for the Texas 4-H and FFA Swine Validation Program. Animals not properly notched in both ears will be disqualified.

BERKSHIRE

1. Black and white with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire character.
2. A Berkshire must have white on face and tail (unless tail is docked). Three of the four legs must be white.
3. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid white or a solid black face from the ears forward.
4. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid black nose (rim of nose).
5. White is allowed on the ears, but neither ear can be entirely white.
6. An occasional splash of white may appear on the body.

HAMPSHIRE

1. Must be black in color with a white belt starting on a front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body.
2. Must possess Hampshire Breed character. (ears must be erect and not rounded)
3. Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
4. Must NOT have any red hair.

SPOTTED SWINE

1. Must be black and white.
2. Must possess Spotted Breed character.
3. Ears cannot be erect.
4. Any red tinted or brown spots are ineligible.
5. No solid black head from ears forward.
6. No distinct white belt pattern (hair or skin) encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.
7. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

DUROC

1. Must be red in color and possess Duroc Breed Character (ears must be down and medium size)
2. Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
3. Must NOT have any black hair.
4. Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter.
5. Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.

POLAND CHINA

1. Must possess Poland China breed character.
2. Must be black with a white face and switch (unless tail is docked). Three of the four legs must be white. May have an occasional splash of white on the body.
3. Must have ears down.
4. Must not have evidence of belt formation.
5. Cannot have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
6. Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering of ears with possible ear tags are ineligible.

DARK CROSSBRED

Barrows with undiluted black, and/or red pigmentation, (i.e. not sandy, rusty, or blue) comprising at least 20% of total body area, shall be considered a Dark Cross. These barrows may be black or red belted, black patched or spotted, with Poland China, Hampshire, Berkshire, or Spot appearance. Barrows with only blue pigmentation are **NOT** considered Dark Crosses.

BARROW CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS FOR GROUP #2

CHESTER WHITE

1. Must possess Chester White breed character.
2. Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.
3. Ears must be down and medium size.
4. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

LANDRACE

1. Must be white in color and possess Landrace Breed character. (ears must be down).
2. Must NOT allow any color hair other than white.
3. Must NOT allow more than three spots of skin pigmentation.
4. Must NOT allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted quarter.

YORKSHIRE

1. Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire Breed character. (ears must be erect)
2. Must NOT have any colored hair other than white.
3. Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted silver dollar.
4. Must not have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.

CROSSBRED

Barrows of any coloration pattern or pigmentation are eligible for entry in this breed.

SPECIAL RULES

A minimum of 34 barrows, including the Breed Champions, Reserve Breed Champions, Weight Division Winners, and Weight Division Runner-Ups, will be processed for information. These animals will be sold through the Junior Barrow Auction and processed as a group.

Minimum Standards

1. Minimum and maximum for hot carcass weight, 165 to 220 pounds, respectively.
2. Carcass muscle score is to be equal to or better than the Intermediate (2.0) pictured in the 2000 "Composition and Quality Assessment Procedures," National Pork Board.
3. Carcass meat quality will be subjectively evaluated for the following using the 2000 "Composition and Quality Assessment Procedures," National Pork Board.
 - a. Loin muscle color score greater than 1 and less than 6
 - b. Loin muscle marbling score greater than 1
 - c. Loin muscle firmness and wetness score greater than 1
 - d. Belly at least slightly thick with a minimum of 0.6 inches of thickness at any point
 - e. Abnormalities (Soft, oily fat; steatosis)

Carcasses failing to meet two or more of the minimum quality standards as outlined will be disqualified.

4. Percentage Fat Free Lean will be predicted by the following equation ("Composition and Quality Assessment Procedures," National Pork Board):

Equation for pounds of fat-free lean (FFL)

$$8.588 - 21.896 \times 10^{\text{th}} \text{ rib fat depth, inches} \\ + 3.005 \times 10^{\text{th}} \text{ rib loin muscle area, inches}^2 \\ + 0.465 \times \text{warm carcass weight, pounds}$$

To convert to % fat-free lean, divide by warm carcass weight and multiply by 100

5. Other disqualifications:
 - a. Cryptorchids
 - b. Carcass that requires more than 1% trim due to "old" bruises or infected at injection site, abnormalities, cysts, abscesses, diseased joints, etc.

The carcass judge will select and place the top 10 carcasses on overall carcass merits from among the 15 carcasses with the highest percent fat free lean(FFL). The following awards will be given for 1st through 10th place.
