SPECIAL RULES

This show is subject to the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo General Rules, the Junior Livestock Show Special Rules, and Special Rules listed in this section.

- 1. Entry:** Each owner must fill out one Junior Breeding Form listing breed and number of head. Junior exhibitors may enter the same animal in the Open show. An additional \$25.00 entry fee must be paid per head for the Open show. The show reserves the right to pen a minimum of three head per pen. Partnership animals are ineligible for the Junior Livestock Show.
- 2. Ownership/Registration:** Animals must be registered in the Herdbook of their Association in the name of the Junior owner on or before Nov. 1st, the year preceding the Show. Purchase, delivery, possession and registration must all take place on or before Nov. 1st, the year preceding the show. Superintendents will check Original Registration Certificates at time of check-in. Registration Certificates must be available at all times.
- 3. Identification:** Sheep and goats must have a legible ear identification number, either tag or tattoo, corresponding to registration certificate upon arrival on the Grounds. Boer Goats without legible tattoos will be disqualified and not eligible for awards and premiums.
- 4. Number Shown:** Each owner may show as many as two (2) animals in each single class.
- 5. Abnormalities:** Sheep or goats showing any pronounced defect or abnormality will be barred from showing.
- 6. Angora Goat Age:** Angora goats will be shown by the age on the Registration Certificate.
- 7. Boer Goat Age:** Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate, will be used to determine the class divisions. The show date will be the base date in computing ages. Take the show date and count back to the birth date of the goat to determine the age and the class for the animal.
- 8. Sheep Age:** Sheep will be shown according to tooth development. There will be no appeal from this determination.
 - (a) All lambs in order to be eligible to compete in their respective classes, must be carrying all milk teeth at the time of check-in. Lambs showing either or both of their first pair of permanent incisors will not be eligible to show in any of the lamb classes. Lambs under six months of age will not be eligible.
 - (b) Sheep eligible to compete in the two-tooth breeding classes must show only the first pair of permanent incisors. Sheep, which have dropped their central pair of milk teeth and show one or both teeth of first permanent pair are eligible to show as singles only in the two-tooth class of their respective breed. Lambs may be shown in the two-tooth class if the exhibitor has shown at least two entries in the lamb class.
 - (c) 4-6-tooth classes - Sheep must show the first two or three pairs of permanent incisors. Lambs will not be allowed in the 4-6 tooth class.
 - (d) Sheep showing more than three pairs of permanent incisors will not be allowed to show.
- 9. Shearing Guidelines:**
 - Delaine Merino** Aged (4-6 tooth) only must be shorn to the skin on or before March 15, of the calendar year preceding the show.
 - Rambouillet** must be machine shorn on or after October 20, of the calendar year preceding the show, leaving a uniform length over the entire body. Sheep with a staple length in excess of two inches at any point on the body, excluding the boots, will be ineligible to show.
 - Medium Wool** must be shorn slick to the skin above the knee and hock joints. Shearing should occur prior to entering the grounds.
 - Angora Goats** must be machine shorn to the skin on or after August 1, of the calendar year preceding the show.
 - Boer Goat** fitting will be left up to the discretion of the exhibitor.
- 10. Pens:** Pens will NOT be taken apart or altered in any way without approval of the Superintendents. No lights are to be strung on the pens.

11. Trimming Tables: Trimming tables will be allowed in the barn and must be placed in locations designated by the Superintendents.

12. Equipment: Blocking of aisles with any kind of equipment (showboxes, feed pans, feed, etc.) is strictly prohibited.

13. Animals Outside of Barns: Sheep or goats must remain inside the Morris Activity Center at all times. Any animal found outside of this area will be subject to disqualification.

14. Heelers/Assistants: The use of heelers (assistants in the show ring) is not permitted.

15. Premiums: The following sliding scale of placings and premiums apply.
